IV. California Healthy Kids Survey Presentation: Jose Carrillo/ ICOE

- ❖ Data Analysis- complying DFC data
- ❖ 4 core measures
 - Past 30 day use
 - Average age of onset
 - Perception of risk
 - Perception of parental disapproval
- ❖ Preliminary Data
 - CHKS is mandated every 2 years
 - Working on correct module
 - Administered in 5, 7, 9, and 11 grade
 - Self- reporting, which can lead to bragging
- ❖ 7th grade
 - Past 30 days
 - Alcohol: 13-18% admit drinking one full glass in last 3 surveys
 - Marijuana: 4-5%
 - Tobacco: 5-6%
 - Age of Onset (07-08 survey):
 - 29% alcohol- age 12 or younger
 - 4% marijuana- age 12 or younger
 - 6% tobacco- age 12 or younger
- ❖ 9th grade
 - Past 30 days
 - Alcohol consumption 30-34%
 - Marijuana 9-12%
 - Tobacco 11-16%
- ❖ 11th grade
 - Past 30 days
 - Alcohol 39-45%
 - Marijuana 9-11%
 - Tobacco 11-15%
 - Age of onset- age 12 or younger
 - Alcohol 15%
 - Marijuana 5%
 - Tobacco 9%
- ❖ How harmful do you think it's to use the following substances: Harmful/ Extremely Harmful
 - Alcohol: 7th grade (03-04 school year) 74% & (05-06) 76% , 9th grade (03-04) 66% & (05-06) 66%, 11th grade (03-04) 64% & (05-06) 66%
 - Marijuana: 7th grade (03-04) 88% & (05-06) 92%, 9th grade (03-04) 82% & (05-06) 87%, 11th grade (03-04) 64% & (05-06) 82%
 - Tobacco: 7th grade (03-04) 82% & (05-06) 88%, 9th grade (03-04) 78% & (05-06) 78%, 11th grade (03-04) 76% & (05-06) 82%
- ❖ Perception of Risk: 07-08 school year
 - Alcohol: 7th grade 47%, 9th grade 47%, 11th grade 53%
 - Marijuana: 7th grade 61%, 9th grade 29%, 11th grade 61%
 - Tobacco: 7th grade 55%, 9th grade 58%, 11th grade 62%
